The Livestock Supplier Certificate must be prepared under the letterhead of the supplying agent.

The verifiable reference (b), documentation of birth date and parentage (e), and vaccination records (f) must be attached to the Livestock Supplier Certificate.

The documents provided under this provision must be available in English for audit purposes.

If awardee cannot obtain a Livestock Supplier Certificate with verifiable reference and/or documentation of birth date and parentage, awardee assumes responsibility for ensuring livestock parentage, health, productivity, and reproductive status, and must document their files to indicate what quality assurance practices were followed in lieu. This may include but is not limited to:

- Physical examination of each animal prior to shipment and/or upon receipt by a qualified animal health professional,
- Physical examination of transport equipment prior to shipment and/or upon receipt,
- Examination of each imported animal by competent national authority,
- Quarantine upon arrival in project area equivalent to all disease latency periods for diseases endemic to area of origin and area of project implementation,
- Vaccination and/or treatment of each animal by awardee.

Records of these steps must be maintained in the event that USAID/BHA wishes to review them. Either the intent to purchase certified animals or a list of quality assurance practices must be explicitly detailed in an application submission.

- 1 Livestock include sheep, goats, cattle, buffalo, yak, swine, camelids (camels, lamas, alpacas, vicuna), equids (donkeys, horses, mules), poultry (e.g. chickens, ducks, geese, turkeys, quail), bee colonies, fish, mollusks, and micro-stock (e.g. rabbits, guinea pigs, grass cutters).
- ² A verifiable reference is a certificate from a competent government authority, or letter from a previous NGO/PIO client with full contact information including
 - 1. Organization name
 - 2. Individual contact name
 - 3. Phone number
 - 4. Email address
 - 5. Website, and
 - 6. Full physical address.
- ³ Productive is defined as producing or able to produce the intended products (e.g. milk, meat, offspring, hair, wool, hides, honey, wax, eggs).
- ⁴ Cattle should have freeze brands on the lower leg or hot brands where necessary supplemented with ear tags. Sheep and goats should have ear tattoos and/or tail web tattoos.
